Divine Healing

Healing is the restoring of health. For something to be restored, it must be brought back to it's original condition. This can include fixing something that was damaged, finding and returning something that was lost, or even recreating something which is beyond repair. Since healing is the restoring of health, it follows that it is a repairing, returning, or recreating of that which has been damaged or lost, whether it was through sickness, wound, or other injury. Many different methods are often used to promote and aid in the process, but the true source of healing is God because He alone possesses the power to restore and recreate. Divine healing is the most direct way and is purely supernatural: in other words, divine healing bypasses all natural and artificial remedies and methods and is the power of God working unhindered by human intervention.

There are only two primary forces that are in existence: the force of good and the force of evil. One creates while the other destroys. God is the only source of good, but what about evil?

The Source of Evil

The true history of our planet is found in ONE place and that's THE BIBLE. We are told that God is good and outside of him is evil, so all who are united with God will naturally have the goodness of God and all who are apart from him will be evil. There was one creature, an angel, who chose life apart from God. By so doing he became the first to experience evil, thus intruducing the entire universe to the principle of separation from God and influencing others to chose the same.

Consequences of Evil

"A consequence is a result of an action." The actions of our parents affect our lives, and the fruits of our lives also affect our environment. The same is true of evil: with the introduction of evil (sin), it carried with it death as the natural consequence. It follows then, that all sickness, disease, germs, viruses, harmful bacteria and everything that destroys life and leads to death came as the consequence of sin, and pain, suffering and death is the direct result.

The plan of Restoration

Man was created perfect along with everything else that was perfectly good before evil entered. God's plan of salvation includes the restoration of man to perfect goodness. This is accomplished by removing the cause which is evil (separation from God). If man is re-united with God, death is abolished and sin is taken away, first in the individual and then, at a later time when the world is cleansed of all sinners, the environment as well.

Jesus the Restorer

In his mission statement Jesus made it clear what he was ordained to do. His mission began the moment he spoke about it and continues to this very day. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised, To preach the acceptable year of the Lord." (Luke 4:18-19)

All his life this was his mission and dedication: the restoration of man to his former state. It was to be continued through to the end of time by him working from within his representatives on earth through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Here is the commission he gave to his followers to continue the mission, with the assurance that his power would accompany his work: Mark 16:15-18, 20. The book of Acts records the continuance of this mission by His disciples as long as they lived. (Acts 5:16)

God's will

It has always been the will of God ever since man's fall to restore him to his perfect state, both spiritually and physically. God's promise to his people of old was: "...If thou wilt diligently hearken to the voice of the LORD thy God, and wilt do that which is right in his sight, and wilt give ear to his commandments, and keep all his statutes, I will put none of these diseases upon thee, which I have brought upon the Egyptians: for I am the LORD that healeth thee." (Ex 15:26) And He is still the same today.

Condition same as Salvation

"Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits: Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases; Who redeemeth thy life from destruction; who crowneth thee with lovingkindness and tender mercies." (Ps. 103:2-4) The same God that forgives sin is the same God that heals. What qualifies us for the gift of salvation? Our need. What qualifies us for the gift of restored health? Our need. As long as we have a need, He is willing and ready to heal and restore. For many, the problem and the solution is so confused and distorted that they never come to a full understanding of the facts. Even the Bible gives examples of people who, during their sickness, did not seek the Lord for healing but instead went to the doctors, resulting in their death. (Here is an example: 2Chron 16:12). It is also clear from scriptures that medicines will not cure. (Jer 46:11)

The faith factor

It is a fact that people have been healed instantly in many cases, even in our day, but the ONLY reason has been that of faith, or trust. It is only by trusting God with our condition that we can expect salvation and restoration. Faith in God is the key, yet it seems to be the scarcest commodity in our present age. It is true that people today have faith—great faith—but not in God. When a person is able to allow someone to put them to sleep artificially and use a knife and cut them to pieces, then give them tablets made with all kinds of deadly chemicals combined, and they do it willingly without hesitation, there is no other word to describe such action than GREAT FAITH.

The Basis of faith

Trust is a more common word that is synonymous with faith, so let's talk about trust. We develop trust because of our experience with others: total strangers meet and become acquainted, acquaintance leads to friendship, and the friendship, if cultivated, will continue to grow into a closer and more trusting relationship. A friendship that is not maintained by constant communion and fellowship will not develop trust, because trust is based upon knowing and understanding a person.

For us to trust God fully (with all our heart), we have to know him. As with any relationship, we must cultivate and develop it by spending time in prayer (talking with him) and Bible study (HIM talking to us). There is also the privilege of hearing his voice speak to us. (Isa 30:21)

Today

It is very clear from scripture, especially the book of Acts and the writings of Paul, that the disciples and those who received the Holy Spirit which brought new life, ALL became witnesses of the power of God in restoring man. However, between then and now, something terrible happened and the power of Jesus was lost from His people, so today sickness and disease are taking lives. It is a rare thing indeed for one to turn to God any more because He is not seen to be the same God He has always been. This is a great tragedy. Faith is not taught or practiced any more so the people have no example around them. Even the churches of today promote healing through doctors before God, and it would be safe to say that most of these doctors don't know Him. The greatest need in the world today is that of faith, or trust in God, to lay hold on His promises to us of salvation and healing to both our souls and bodies. "Today if you will hear my voice harden not your heart." God wants to heal you today, of sin and all it's consequences—give him a chance!
